**WHEREAS**, foster, kinship and adoptive families, who open their homes and hearts and support children whose families are in crisis, play a vital role in helping children and families heal and reconnect thereby launching young people into successful adulthood, and;

**WHEREAS**, dedicated foster families frequently adopt foster children, resulting in a greater need for more foster families, and;

**WHEREAS**, there are numerous individuals, public and private organizations who work to increase public awareness of the needs to children in and leaving foster care as well as the enduring and valuable contribution of foster parents, and the foster care “system” is only as good as those who choose to be part of it.

**NOW, THEREFORE**, I, Allen Bryson, by virtue of the authority vested in me as Mayor of the City of Clinton, do hereby proclaim May as FOSTER CARE MONTH in Clinton and urge all citizens to come forward and do something positive that will help change a lifetime for children and youth in foster care.
