Wade Anders opened the meeting with prayer and Councilman Bob Marcy led the Pledge of Allegiance.

AGENDA ITEM NO. 4 ACTION ITEMS

4A. REQUEST IMPLEMENTATION OF MANDATORY CONSERVATION FOR LANDSCAPE IRRIGATION REFERENCING ORDINANCE NO. 935A

City Manager Steve Hewitt explained the ordinance establishes a stricter policy for recreational/ landscape watering. He said it sets hours and day for watering. He said if the ordinance is approved the public will be educated on the policy and required to abide by the rules.

Councilman Marcy asked how residents would be notified of the policy.

City Manager Steve Hewitt said notification would be made through the media, water bill memos, and staff notification.

Councilman Rodolph suggested rather than allowing two hours on one day of the week for watering, that the policy allow one hour on two days of the week.

City Manager Hewitt said it does not matter.

L.R. Sights said it would not make a difference. He said he would like more but understands that we must conserve.

City Manager Hewitt said as the temperatures increase, the usage of water spikes. He said an evaluation can be made of the usage and a policy implemented.

Councilman Hulin asked about the implementation of conservation to users outside of the city limits.

City Manager Hewitt said if a person uses city water they are under the same restrictions as someone living inside city limits.

L.R. Sights asked about industrial water users and asked about the bad odor from Bar-S.

City Manager Steve Hewitt said the industrial water users are doing their part to reduce usage. Mayor Bryson said the odor issue had been discussed with Bar-S and the City will work with them.

Motion was made by Councilwoman Smith and seconded by Councilman Rodolph to adopt Ordinance No. 935A with the amendment regarding water use restriction time for 7:00 P.M. to 11:00 P.M. with the emergency clause.

ORDINANCE NO. 935A

AN ORDINANCE TO APPLY WATER USE RESTRICTIONS

WHEREAS, the City has previously adopted Ordinance No. 935.

WHEREAS, implementation of Ordinance No. 935 has failed to properly address water shortage issues.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF CITY OF CLINTON, OKLAHOMA:

I. Section 3 of Ordinance 935 (Codified as 9-5-3), of the Clinton City Code of Ordinances, shall be repealed and replaced as follows:


Section 3. WATER USE RESTRICTION

1. Water use restrictions will begin with voluntary implementation beginning March 1st of each year and mandatory implementation beginning June 1st, until September 30th of each year. Use restrictions shall include the following restrictions:
 - A. Outdoor irrigation of landscaping with sprinkler systems and hose-end sprinklers will be limited to two (2) hours once a week
 1. Residents and business with even numbered addresses will be allowed to water on Tuesdays for any two (2) hours between 8:00 p.m. and 12:00 a.m. only.
 2. Residents and business with odd numbered addresses will be allowed to water on Thursdays for any two (2) hours between 8:00 p.m. and 12:00 a.m. only.
 - B. Outdoor irrigation of landscaping utilizing hand watering, drip irrigation and soaker hoses shall be allowed every day of the week for two (2) hours per day from 7:00 p.m. to 11:00 p.m. All hoses must be equipped with a positive shutoff valve.
 - C. After June 1st of each year, existing swimming pools can only be filled to replace normal water loss due to evaporation.
 1. Permits for new swimming pools (either above or below ground) will be delayed until after October 1st of each year.
 - D. Use of fountains is prohibited.

- E. Restaurants may only serve a glass of water upon request by the customer.
- F. Vehicle washing is limited to commercial and mobile car washing only.
 - 1. Personal washing of vehicles is prohibited at any location not specifically designed and permitted for vehicle washing.
- G. Washing down of sidewalks, walkways, driveways, parking lots, streets and gutters is prohibited.
- H. Washing down of buildings is prohibited, unless for fire protection.
- I. All water leaks must be repaired within a reasonable time frame.

II. Emergency Clause. This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon adoption.
