**4A. PRESENTATION OF FINANCIAL UPDATE**

Debra Blanchard, City Treasurer, presented a power point presentation that included revenues vs expenditures as of Oct. 31, 2012 and a monthly sales tax collection comparison 2006-2012.

Debra Blanchard, City Treasurer, said that we are on track with revenues vs expenditures, with the exception of the Airport Authority. Revenue is high there because of the oil and gas lease.

Sales tax collections are up compared to this time last year partly due to the oil and gas industry in the area. Councilman Marcy asked if this was due to the good economy in our area. City Treasurer, Debra Blanchard said she thought our economy was not hit like the other areas in the US, keeping our sales taxes up.

## **5. CITY MANAGERS REPORT**

City Manager Steve Hewitt reported on several different projects that the city has going on. The Police Department remodel project is finishing up; there are a few pieces of equipment yet to purchase. The construction of the new Fire Station is going well; the outside walls are going up at this time. We are seeing great progress there. Chapman Road project is moving along, we received federal approval on the water shed, and we will be acquiring right-of-way easements soon. ODOT should be ready to go to bid with this project in the spring. This project will roll over into the next budget year, freeing up the monies this year for other Capital budget items. We are still waiting on the Federal Government to complete the inspections and repairs on the Roush Center, hopefully that will happen after the New Year. Water well testing is ongoing hope to have results soon
