In 2010 Clinton Regional Airport did a lighting project which involved the relocation of our rotating beacon. During construction we went from a beacon tower to a mono pole which is now located by our translosures. The original beacon tower is currently located behind the maintenance hangar, unused.

I was approached by an individual who expressed interest in the tower. After verification with our airport engineer, we are able to remove the old tower with some stipulations.
