MAY 1, 2018**

Minutes of the regular meeting of the Mayor and City Council of the City of Clinton, Oklahoma, Custer County, held in the City Council Room, City Hall on Tuesday, May 1, 2018 at 5:30 p.m. A notice of this meeting with agenda was posted on the bulletin board in the lobby of Clinton City Hall on Thursday, April 26, 2018.

AGENDA ITEM NO. 4 ACTION ITEMS

4A. CONSIDER SURPLUSING AND DISPOSING OF FENCE AROUND PUTT PUTT IN MCLAIN ROGERS PARK

City Manager Mark Skiles said Beautification Committee has been working on upgrades to McLain Rogers Park. He explained that work is currently underway at the putt putt and the chain-link fence is being replaced and private individuals are putting in money for upgrades to the individual holes. He said an individual had volunteered to take down the chain-link fence and wanted to keep it. Skiles felt that was a fair trade for his labor. He said the city crews are working on other improvements in the park.

Motion was made by Councilman Stewart and seconded by Councilman Rodolph to surplus and dispose of the fence around the putt putt in McLain Rogers Park.

4B. REQUEST AUTHORIZATION TO PURCHASE DETECTIVE UNIT AND INSTALLATION OF EQUIPMENT IN UNIT

Police Chief David Crabtree explained that a 2007 Chevrolet Tahoe had been totaled during a gunfight. He said that insurance had paid \$9,785.00. Two estimates were presented on replacement vehicles. Crabtree recommended the purchase of a 2018 Ford Explorer from McKinsey Ford for \$28,178 which is less than the state contract price.

Crabtree estimated that replacement and installation of equipment on the unit would be \$2,000.00.

Councilman Hulin asked about previous units being used vehicles.

Crabtree said that the price of low mileage vehicles was so close to a new vehicle and a new vehicle would come with warranty.

Motion was made by Councilman Rodolph and seconded by Councilman Stewart to authorize the purchase of the 2018 Ford Explorer from McKinsey Ford and the installation of equipment.

Councilman Stewart said the work on the tower of the slide at the swimming pool complex is progressing.

City Manager Skiles said the work will be done this week on the slide. He said the Highway I-40 water line relocation will begin shortly. He said the Hub Diner is now open and train rides are available at Acme Brick Park.
