City Manager Skiles said the light is not broken but has a timing issue.

Public Works Director Donald Webb said the timer is set for 30 seconded both directions but he has been receiving complaint regarding the length of time drivers have to wait to proceed.

City Manager Skiles said this intersection does not have pressure sensitive pads.

Councilman Hulin said an effective traffic control is needed at the intersection and suggested having the light fixed rather than the four-way stop signs.

Webb said that technicians have looked at the lights three different time and have not found a problem.

Mayor Berrong recommended looking into the cost of sensor pads.

Councilman Hulin reported on a couples tournament held at Riverside Golf Course this weekend. He said that 69 couples teams competed in the two day tournament last weekend.
