

Councilman Hendrickson asked if the City is still pursuing purchasers for these properties.

City Manager Bottom said yes.

Motion was made by Councilman Hendrickson and seconded by Councilman Marcy to approve Resolution 773 regarding the transfer of land located in Lots 19-24 of Block 17 in Clinton Original Townsite to the Clinton Industrial Authority.

Vice-Mayor Bryson put the motion to a roll call vote:

Vice-Mayor declared the motion carried.

5. CITY MANAGER'S REPORT

City Manager Grayson Bottom reported that the City had received notice whereby the City of Clinton has been recommended for a \$30,000 grant from the Oklahoma Centennial Commission. He said this had been received too late to include on the agenda but the due date for submittal of the grant is August 15th so the next agenda will have an item to affirm the action taken.

City Manager Bottom reported that Assistant City Attorney Ryan Meacham has been reviewing and preparing a Social Host Ordinance that will be presented for Council consideration.

City Manager Bottom reported that the City has received a request for permits from Veritas DGC Land Incorporated for 3-D seismic survey on various properties owned by the City of Clinton inside city limits. Bottom said he has concerns and wanted a chance to discuss this project with the Council.

Michael Wilks, representative of Veritas, said the proposed survey within Clinton is for property south of Modelle. He said the total project covers 454 square miles. He explained that cable would be laid in a grid and a vibrator truck would serve as the energy source. He said the target areas are city parks so as to avoid going through homeowner's yards.

Councilman Marcy asked as a property owner, what would happen on private property?

Mr. Wilks said that if the City approved the request, homeowners would be contacted and neighborhoods would be notified before work began. He said the advantage of the survey would be to the mineral owner.

Councilman Marcy asked about damages.

Mr. Wilks said there would be no damages and said this same type of survey had been completed in Sayre, Marlow and Rush Springs. He recommended those communities be contacted as references.

Councilman Hendrickson said the shaking would be to city streets, water and sewer lines and city property. He asked if the company is insured and bonded and about long-term coverage.

Mr. Wilks said if there were any damages, they would be immediate.

Vice-Mayor Bryson asked that Veritas provide a list of the cities personnel they dealt with in the other communities. He said the rate of \$10.00 per acre is stated on the permit so the city would receive a small amount of compensation but asked if the homeowner would receive compensation.

Mr. Wilks said the majority of lines would be in the alley.

Betty Schumacher asked if the city approves the permit, does the landowner have the right to reject.

Mr. Wilks said the homeowner does have the right to reject.

Vice-Mayor Bryson restated that the permit would allow the usage of city facilities and if the private property owner wished to reject, they would have that right.

C.B. Graft said he disagreed with the information being presented. He stated that guidelines with the Oklahoma Corporation Commission would have to be complied with such as a 15-day notice and he said there are limitations on locations.

Councilman Hendrickson said that Attorney Mart Tisdal could give Council additional information on this topic.

Leroy Livesay asked why Veritas wants to do this work inside city limits.

Mr. Wilks said they do not want to leave a void in the area they are trying to map out. He said sometimes there is consideration for wells inside city limits.

Keith Marcy asked what the timeframe on a project of this type was.

Mr. Wilks said the cable would be on the ground for approximately two weeks and the shaking would be 7 to 10 days.

Ken Hamar said he was concerned for water lines and structure damage that might take time to surface.

Mr. Wilks said motion companies monitor the project to insure industrial standards are met.

C.B. Graft asked about the vehicles that would be utilized for this project.

Mr. Wilks said four vibrators, pickups, a.t.v's and helicopters but probably not inside the city limits. He said the work could be conducted 24 hours per day but inside city limits it would be approximately 9:00 a.m. to 4:30p.m. and would last from 10 to 15 seconds.

Tom Snider asked about leased property.

Luke Adams said that Mart Tisdal is prepared to advise the Council on the project.
