Good morning,

Thank you for taking my call. If my writing is not legible, here is what we wanted to present to the city council.

Information, facts and documents to bring awareness of the depletion of the Rush Springs Aquifer. Clinton is on this Aquifer as well as towns in 14 counties.

A USGS study of our aquifer came out Nov, 30, 2018 showing if the Oklahoma Water Resources Board doesn't slow the rate of water being taken from the ground from 2 acre feet to .82 acre feet, anyone who lives on the Rush Springs won't have water in 20 years.

There are at least 6 sand mines trying to surround Fay and these mines will be taking over 2 billion gallons of water a year. One mine alone will be about as much water as the City of Clinton takes a year.

The USGS study was done NOT INCLUDING THESE MINES.

We just want to let the City of Clinton know about this concern if we want to have water in the coming years and what people can possibly do to help save the Rush Springs Aquifer.
