**AGENDA ITEM NO. 2 CONSIDER, DISCUSS AND TAKE ACTION ON RESOLUTION 903  
REGARDING CITY OF CLINTON'S COVID-19 VIRUS POLICY**

Mayor Berrong explained that Governor Stitt has discussed the Open and Recovery Safely Plan and ther executive orders he has issued with the four amendments. Mayor cited Ordinance 900 that the City of Clinton had approved in March 2020.

Mayor discussed Phase I of the plan that includes the possibility of opening up workout facilities effective May 1, 2020.

Morgan Bonnarens outlined options for Acme Brick Park workout center. Patrons eighteen and older would be allowed in the building but no more than twenty people at one time. She said attendants would be wiping down the equipment and the public would have access to the front restrooms while traffic would be monitored.

Mayor Berrong said that temperature checks should be considered for employees. He asked about sanitation and disinfectant guidelines.

Bonnarens said she was confident about limiting the age group and the number of people at the facility.

Councilman Dowdell said he was against the issue of opening up the facility. He didn't see a reson for a hurry and suggested waiting another two weeks.

Councilman McComas said he was not in favor of opening up the facility.

Councilman Jones suggested waiting until the next City Council meeting to discuss again. He said there is no reason to jump the gun.

Councilman Stewart asked how many staff members work at Acme Brick Park.

Bonnarens said three employees are there at one time. She said the facility opens at 4 am.

Mayor Berrong said this item will be placed on the May 5<sup>th</sup> agenda.

City Manager Skiles said the Frisco Center is closed to the public and during the closure, the wax has been stripped of the floor and painting to the interior is underway. He reported that the Senior Citizens Center continues to be closed to the public.

Tim Miller of the Western Plains Library System said the library is looking at a tentative date to open as May 11<sup>th</sup>. He said the board will be meeting on May 8<sup>th</sup> to discuss the details.

It was announced that the Southwest Playhouse Board has dismissed the season through May.
