

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- 1. Regulated Medical Waste Services.** (a) Stericycle, Inc. shall collect, transport, treat and dispose of all Regulated Medical Waste (except Non-Conforming Waste) generated by Customer during the term of this Agreement. (b) Responsibility for transportation of Regulated Medical Waste collected from Customer shall transfer and vest in Stericycle at the time it is loaded onto Stericycle's vehicle. Customer shall have title to Regulated Medical Waste at all prior times. Customer shall hold title to any Non-Conforming Waste at all times, whether refused for collection or returned to the customer for proper disposal after collection. All Regulated Medical Waste must be accompanied by a properly completed shipping document pursuant to 49 CFR 172.202-172-204 (Shipping Papers). (c) Stericycle employees may refuse containers that are determined to be Non-Conforming Waste as identified in the Waste Acceptance Policy (WAP). Customer shall place only "Regulated Medical Waste" as defined by 49 CFR 173.134 or by any other federal, state, and local regulations. (d) Customer represents and warrants that i) the waste presented for disposal will not contain any "hazardous", "toxic", "radioactive" or Non-Conforming Wastes as defined by all applicable laws, regulations and the WAP, ii) the waste strictly conforms to Stericycle's WAP and their local laws and regulations concerning Regulated Medical Waste and iii) they have reviewed the attached WAP and its complete definitions and requirements. (e) Customer shall be liable for any and all injuries, losses and damages resulting from Non-Conforming Waste. (f) All lab wastes or materials which contain or have the potential to contain infectious substances arising from those agents listed under 42 CFR 72.3 are strictly prohibited from medical waste by federal law and must be pretreated prior to disposal. (g) Further definitions are included under the current WAP, which is attached and made a part of this Agreement and specifically incorporated herein. Stericycle reserves the right to change the WAP at any time to ensure compliance with applicable laws or regulations. A copy of Stericycle's WAP may also be obtained from your local Stericycle representative or at <https://www.stericycle.com/en-us/about-us/policies-positions>. The Services are further outlined in Attachment C.
- 2. Term, Pricing and Termination.** The initial term of this Agreement is established on page one of this document, 60 months from the effective date of this agreement ("Initial Term"). Thereafter, this Agreement shall automatically renew for consecutive ninety (90) day terms (each an "Extended Term"), provided that either party may terminate this Agreement during an Extended Term upon sixty (60) days' prior written notice to the other party. The Initial Term and any Extended Terms shall together be referred to as the "Term".

 - (a) Stericycle may increase the Service Fees during each year of the Term by the greater of 4% or Consumer Price Index (CPI-M) after the initial twelve (12) months. Thereafter, price increases may be implemented on each subsequent anniversary date of the initial price increase. Stericycle reserves the right, during the Extended Term, to increase its rates at a percentage higher than the rate listed in Section 2(a). Additionally, Stericycle may further adjust the Service Fees or add or modify surcharges to account for operational changes it implements to comply with changes in law and/or changes in Customer's service requirements, or to otherwise cover unforeseen, significant cost escalation.
 - (b) Stericycle has instituted a per invoice fuel surcharge to manage and isolate the impact of Diesel fuel price fluctuations. The fuel surcharge is based on the U.S. 'On Highway' Diesel Price Index. A table outlining the Fuel Surcharge can be found at www.stericycle.com.
 - (c) In the event of breach of any provision of this Agreement, the non-breaching party shall notify the breaching party in writing of the specific nature of the breach and shall request that it be cured. If the breaching party does not cure the breach within thirty (30) days of such notice, the non-breaching party may immediately terminate this Agreement on written notice to the breaching party, and such termination shall not preclude the non-breaching party from pursuing any and all remedies available to it at law or in equity. Either party may terminate this Agreement for convenience by giving the other party at least sixty (60) days' notice, however, if Customer terminates this Agreement for convenience, it shall be required to pay the early termination fee described in Section 2(d).
 - (d) If Customer breaches this Agreement by terminating Stericycle's collections prior to the expiration of its Term or in any other way violates this agreement in such a way that Stericycle's continued performance is rendered impossible or commercially impracticable, then Stericycle shall be entitled to collect from Customer an amount in liquidated damages (a) equal to 50% if in first 12 months of agreement (b) equal to 45% if in months 12 through 24, or (c) equal to 40% if past the initial 24 months of the agreement, of Customer's average charge on a monthly basis based on the 12 months' billings prior to the cessation of collections (or based on any lesser period if the contract began less than twelve months earlier) times the number of months, including prorated partial months, remaining until the expiration date of the Term or Extension Term. Customer hereby acknowledges (i) that Stericycle's damages resulting from the premature termination of collections include lost profits, inefficiencies resulting from route changes and reduced treatment plant throughput, increased administrative overhead, unrecoverable sunk training/instruction costs, and other elements of injury, (ii) that such damages are extremely difficult to quantify as they relate to any one customer, and (iii) that the foregoing liquidated damages amount is a reasonable estimate of actual expected damages and is not a penalty. Liquidated damages as described herein is Stericycle's sole remedy for Customer's improper early termination.
 - (e) Stericycle shall have the right to terminate this Agreement at any time by giving Customer at least sixty (60) days' notice in the event that it is unable to continue performing its obligations under this Agreement due to the suspension, revocation, cancellation or termination of any permit or required to perform this Agreement or in the event that a change in any law, regulation or ordinance makes it impractical or uneconomical, in Stericycle's sole discretion, to continue performing this Agreement.
 - (f) Upon 30 days' notice to Stericycle, Customer shall have the right to add or delete mutually acceptable Customer facilities receiving Regulated waste services under this Agreement. This addition or exclusion of any facility participating under this Agreement shall have no effect on the services provided the other participating facilities.
- 3. Billing** (a) Customer shall pay in full each Stericycle invoice within 30 days of the date of such invoice by ACH or other agreed upon electronic means. Any invoiced amounts not received by Stericycle within that timeframe will be subject to a late fee of 1.5% per month (or the maximum amount

allowed by law, if different) on the outstanding balance. Customer shall reimburse Stericycle for all costs that it incurs in collecting overdue amounts from Customer. Stericycle may, with notice, suspend services until any overdue amounts (plus late fees, and enforcement and collection costs, if any) are paid. Customer shall also pay all taxes imposed by any governmental authority with respect to the purchase of any services and products hereunder, including all sales, use, excise, occupation, franchise and similar taxes and tax-like fees and charges (but excluding all taxes on Stericycle's net income). Stericycle will cooperate with Customer to determine the applicability of exemption certificates, if any, that Customer provides in a timely manner to Stericycle. Customer shall not be entitled to withhold payment by way of set-off or counterclaim. (b) Stericycle shall submit invoices to Customer in accordance with Stericycle's standard billing process. Stericycle shall not be required to adopt Customer's billing process or to use Customer's preferred billing portal. If Stericycle agrees to depart from its standard billing process (which is entirely within Stericycle's discretion), such agreement may be made provided that: (i) Customer agrees to pay a billing surcharge; (ii) Customer reimburses Stericycle for all fees or other costs payable for the use of Customer's portal; and/or (iii) Customer agrees to any other reasonable requirements of Stericycle related to the use of non-standard billing processes. Any invoice for which Customer believes is inaccurate must be disputed in writing by Customer within ninety (90) days after receipt thereof. Such disputed invoices will be investigated by Stericycle and the disposition of such investigation will be provided to Customer. In the event such disputed invoice is found to be inaccurate, Stericycle will invoice the amounts underpaid or credit the amounts overpaid to customer as soon as practicable. In the event Customer does not pay the full amount of any disputed invoice, if the invoice is found to be accurate, Customer will be subject to late fees dating from the date of the invoice.

4. Surcharge Stericycle may also impose a surcharge in the event that Stericycle or its Contractor attempts to pick-up Wastes at a Customer location (on either a scheduled pick-up or in response to a Customer request) and, through no fault of Stericycle, either (a) there is no Biomedical Waste for pick-up, (b) Waste is not ready for pick-up or (c) the Customer location is closed. Stericycle may bill additional charges for each non-compliant container provided by Customer. Non-compliant containers subject to additional charges include but are not limited to containers that are overweight under applicable laws, rules, or regulations; those containers exceeding 50 lbs.; containers holding non-conforming waste; and containers where the waste is improperly segregated or packaged.

5. Liability for Equipment Customer shall have the care, custody and control of containers and other equipment owned by Stericycle or its Contractor and placed at Customer's premises and accepts responsibility and liability for the equipment and its contents. Customer agrees to defend, indemnify and hold harmless Stericycle from and against any and all claims for loss or damage to property, or personal injury or death, resulting from or arising in any manner out of Customer's use, operation or possession of any containers and other equipment furnished under this Agreement. Any damage or loss to such containers and equipment, other than normal wear and tear, will be charged to Customer at full replacement value.

6. Indemnification (a) Stericycle shall indemnify and hold Customer harmless from any liabilities arising from the gross negligence or willful misconduct of Stericycle in the performance of its obligations under this Agreement. Customer shall indemnify and hold harmless Stericycle from any liabilities arising from the gross negligence or willful misconduct of Customer, which shall include, but not be limited to, failure to properly store, package, label, or segregate Biomedical Waste and any liabilities relating to Non-Conforming Waste, whether or not collected, transported or treated by Stericycle. Each party agrees to pay the reasonable attorneys' fees and costs incurred by the other in bringing a successful indemnification claim under this Paragraph. Customer agrees to pay Stericycle's reasonable attorney's fees incurred for any successful defense by Stericycle of a suit for indemnification brought against Stericycle by Customer.

7. Compliance Materials To the extent that Stericycle provides Customer with any electronic or printed materials (the "Compliance Materials") it provides these materials subject to a limited license to Customer to use the Compliance Materials for Customer's own, non-commercial use. Stericycle may revoke this license at its discretion at any time. Customer may not copy or distribute the Compliance Materials in any manner, nor use or republish the Compliance Materials for or to any third party or audience, including but not limited to business/trade groups or associations, chambers of commerce, professional, fraternal or educational associations or reciprocating or cooperating service providers. Customer acknowledges the prejudice that it causes to Stericycle by violating the foregoing terms as well as the difficulty in calculating economic damage to Stericycle as a result thereof and therefore agrees to pay to Stericycle the sum of \$5000.00 for each such violation of those terms.

8. Compliance with Laws Stericycle hereby agrees to carry General Liability, Automobile Liability, and Workmen's Compensation Insurance as required by applicable state law, and to otherwise comply with all federal and state laws, rules, and regulations applicable to its performance hereunder. As of the date of this Agreement, Stericycle has all necessary permits, licenses, and other authorizations required to perform the services under this Agreement. Customer hereby agrees to comply with all laws applicable to their respective handling of Biomedical Waste and its performance under this Agreement. Customer acknowledges that Stericycle has advised Customer of the Regulated Medical Waste service frequency requirements within their State (if applicable), and Customer has determined its desired frequency independent of Stericycle's recommendation. Customer hereby agrees to indemnify and hold Stericycle harmless for any decisions around service frequency by Customer that do not comply with state regulations.

9. Exclusivity Customer agrees to use no other providers for the Services during the Term of this Agreement and any Extension Terms.

10. Excuse of Performance Stericycle shall not be responsible if its performance of this Agreement is interrupted or delayed by contingencies beyond its control, including, without limitation, acts of God, war, pandemic or endemic, blockades, riots, explosion, strikes, lockouts or other labor or industrial disturbances, fires, accidents to equipment, injunctions or compliance with laws, regulations, guidelines or orders of any governmental body or instrumentality thereof (whether now existing or hereafter created).

11. Independent Contractor Stericycle's relationship with Customer pursuant hereto is that of an independent contractor, and nothing in this Agreement shall be construed to designate Stericycle as an employee, agent, or partner of or a joint venture with Customer.

12. Amendment and Waiver Changes in the types, size and amount of equipment or the frequency of service may be mutually agreed to orally or in writing by the parties, without affecting the validity of this Agreement. Consent to oral changes shall be evidenced by the practices and actions of the parties. All other amendments to this Agreement (other than as provided in 2(d)) shall be affected only by a written instrument executed by the parties. No waiver shall be effective unless submitted in writing by the party granting such waiver. No waiver of any provision of this Agreement shall be deemed a waiver of any other provision of this Agreement and no waiver of any breach or duty under this Agreement shall be deemed a waiver of any other breach or later instances of the same duty.

13. Savings Clause In case any one or more of the provisions contained in this Agreement shall, for any reason, be held to be invalid, illegal or unenforceable in any respect, such invalidity, illegality or unenforceability shall not affect any other provisions of this Agreement; this Agreement shall be construed as if such invalid, illegal or unenforceable provision had never been contained herein, unless such finding shall impair the rights or increase the obligations of Stericycle hereunder, in which event, at Stericycle's option, this Agreement may be terminated.

14. Entire Agreement This Agreement (including any Exhibits or Attachments, exhibits, attachments, and amendments made in accordance with Paragraph 12) constitutes the entire understanding and agreement of the parties and cancels and supersedes all prior negotiations, representations, understandings or agreements, whether written or oral, with respect to the subject matter of this Agreement. This Agreement shall be binding upon and shall inure to the benefit of the successors, assigns legal representatives and heirs of the parties hereto provided, however, that Customer may not assign its rights or delegate its obligations under this Agreement without the prior written consent of Stericycle, which consent of Stericycle may not unreasonably withhold.

15. Disputes and Governing Law Any dispute arising in connection with or relating to this Agreement or between the parties ("Disputes") that the parties are unable to resolve informally, such as via discussion and negotiation between the parties, shall solely and exclusively be resolved by binding and final arbitration before the American Arbitration Association ("AAA"), conducted pursuant to the Federal Arbitration Act (as the parties acknowledge that the services provided involve interstate commerce) and by means of AAA's Commercial Arbitration Rules and Mediation Procedures (as amended and effective September 1, 2022) ("AAA's Rules"). To the extent that AAA's Rules are subsequently amended, the parties agree that AAA's Rules will be utilized as they existed on September 1, 2022, unless the parties agree otherwise. Expenses of the arbitration (including compensation of the arbitrator) shall at all times be borne equally by the parties, and administrative expenses shall be borne in the manner specified in Rule R-55 of AAA's Rules. The parties will, however, bear their own legal fees. All issues of arbitrability will be decided exclusively by the arbitrator. All Disputes will be determined on an individual basis (and not as a class member or in any purported class or representative capacity), considered unique as to its facts, and shall not be consolidated in any arbitration or other proceeding with any claim or controversy of any other party, and the arbitrator or trier of fact shall not preside over any form of representative or class proceeding. The exclusive jurisdiction and forum for resolution of any Dispute shall be by arbitration, which shall take place in the state where Customer is located at the closest AAA office. This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws in the state of Illinois without regard to the conflicts of laws rules of any jurisdiction.

16. Notices All required notices, or those which the parties may desire to give under this Agreement shall be in writing and sent to the parties' addresses set forth above.

17. Originals A copy or facsimile of this Agreement shall be as effective as an original.

18. Purchase Orders Any terms or conditions contained in any Purchase Order, Purchase Order Agreement, or other invoice acknowledgment, Order by Customer or proposed at any time by Customer in any manner, which vary from, or conflict with the terms and conditions in the Stericycle Service Agreement are deemed to be material alterations and are objected to by Stericycle without need of further notice of objection and shall be of no effect nor in any circumstances binding upon Stericycle unless expressly accepted in writing. If Customer's standard purchase order form is provided to Stericycle in connection with this Agreement, the terms and conditions for that Purchase Order will be superseded by the provisions of this Agreement and the use of the purchase order shall be only to facilitate Customer's payment of fees to Stericycle. Written acceptance or rejection by Stericycle of any such terms or conditions shall not constitute an acceptance of any other additional terms or conditions.

19. Waste Brokers Stericycle reserves the right to deal solely with the Customer and not with any third-party agents of the customer for all purposes relating to this Agreement. Customer represents and warrants to Stericycle that it is the Waste generator and is acting for its own account and not through a broker or agent. Stericycle shall be entitled to terminate this Agreement and seek all available legal remedies, including but not limited to liquidated damages, in the amount set forth herein for Customer's breach of this representation and warranty.

20. Use of Logo Customer approves Stericycle's use of Customer's name and/or logo in Stericycle's marketing and promotional materials, including on Stericycle's website. Customer approves Stericycle's use of Customer's name and/or logo in Compliance Materials to be used at the Service locations.

21. LIMITATION OF LIABILITY NOTWITHSTANDING ANYTHING TO THE CONTRARY CONTAINED IN THIS AGREEMENT OR PROVIDED FOR UNDER ANY APPLICABLE LAW, STERICYCLE WILL NOT BE LIABLE FOR ANY INDIRECT, SPECIAL, INCIDENTAL, OR CONSEQUENTIAL DAMAGES OF ANY KIND (INCLUDING LOST PROFITS, FINES, CIVIL PENALTIES, GOODWILL, DATA, THE COST OF REPLACEMENT GOODS OR SERVICES, OR OTHER INTANGIBLE LOSSES) ARISING FROM OR RELATED TO THIS AGREEMENT, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO STERICYCLE'S BREACH OR ALLEGED BREACH OF THIS AGREEMENT, REGARDLESS OF THE FORM OF ACTION, WHETHER IN CONTRACT, TORT (INCLUDING NEGLIGENCE), OR OTHERWISE, EVEN IF STERICYCLE HAS BEEN ADVISED OF THE

POSSIBILITY OF SUCH DAMAGES. STERICYCLE'S AGGREGATE LIABILITY, IF ANY, IS LIMITED TO THE AMOUNT OF FEES RECEIVED BY STERICYCLE FROM CUSTOMER UNDER THE AGREEMENT DURING THE PRECEDING TWELVE (12) MONTH PERIOD PRIOR TO THE ALLEGED LIABILITY.

22. WARRANTY/DISCLAIMER OF WARRANTIES Stericycle will perform the Services in a professional, workmanlike manner, consistent with applicable industry standards. In the event that the Services do not conform to this warranty and Customer notifies Stericycle of such within ten (10) business days of receipt of non-conforming Services, Stericycle's exclusive obligation (and Customer's exclusive remedy) will be for Stericycle to re-perform such Services at no additional cost to Customer. EXCEPT FOR THE FOREGOING, STERICYCLE MAKES NO OTHER REPRESENTATIONS OR WARRANTIES, EXPRESS OR IMPLIED, EITHER IN FACT OR BY OPERATION OF LAW, BY STATUTE OR OTHERWISE, AND STERICYCLE SPECIFICALLY DISCLAIMS ANY OTHER WARRANTIES, WHETHER WRITTEN OR ORAL, OR EXPRESS OR IMPLIED, INCLUDING ANY WARRANTY OF QUALITY, MERCHANTABILITY OR FITNESS FOR A PARTICULAR USE OR PURPOSE OR ANY WARRANTY AS TO THE SERVICES OR STERICYCLE'S PERFORMANCE HEREIN.

Stericycle reserves the right to charge for a minimum container weight for each container collected at a customer's site. The minimum weight is determined to be 65% of a container's gallon capacity. Stericycle will assign a minimum weight per each container type that equates to 1 lb. per each gallon of capacity (e.g., a 30-gallon container has a minimum weight of 19.5lbs). If the weight of each container collected does not meet the assigned minimum weight for that container type, Stericycle will charge the current per lb. rate to the assigned minimum weight to calculate the container price.

Attachment C - Regulated Medical Waste Scope of Work

Program Design & Start-Up:

- Customer will maintain the security of waste storage and staging.
- Customer will provide waste volume information to determine collection and disposal service needs.

- Stericycle will provide a service schedule based on service needs of Customer.

Training:

- Stericycle will provide Biohazardous Waste Segregation training available on Stericycle's online training center.
- Stericycle will provide Customer with electronic waste packaging resources.

Service Process:

- Customer will segregate and label waste in accordance with all Local, State, and Federal regulations or as required by Stericycle's WAP.
- Customer will prepare waste packaging in accordance with container instructions.
- Customer will package waste complying with Department of Transportation (DOT) packaging requirements for the shipment of Regulated Medical Waste.
- Stericycle shall have the right to refuse any waste which may be perceived as improperly packaged, including but not limited to leaking containers, unsealed boxes, and/or containers with visible structural degradation.
- Stericycle will provide waste disposal containers and generator labels for Customer.
- Customer will contact Stericycle when additional waste containers are required for service.
- Stericycle will collect and transport properly packaged Regulated Medical Waste prepared for transport by Customer on scheduled service days for destruction.

Attachment D - Agreement Definitions

The following definitions shall apply to the Agreement to which this Attachment D is attached:

Agreement means the Waste Streams Agreement dated as of the Effective Date between Stericycle and Customer to which this Attachment G is attached, including all amendments, Change Orders, Attachments and Attachments thereto.

Effective Date or Agreement Effective Date means the Agreement Effective Date set forth on the first page of the Agreement.

Initial Term has the meaning given to it in Section 2 of the Agreement.

Location means each location/premises of the Customer that receives Services and that is set forth on the first page of the Agreement and/or Attachment B of the Agreement.

Pathological Waste means tissues, organs, surgical specimens, amputated limbs, lab cultures, vaccines and vaccine production related waste, microbiological specimens.

Customer means the entity listed on the first page of the Agreement as the Customer.

Conforming Waste means Waste that is tendered to Stericycle for Services under this Agreement in compliance with the terms of this Agreement and applicable Law and that: (a) fully conforms to correct and complete Waste Characterization Data; (b) conforms in its content to any associated labelling or packaging; (c) is properly segregated from other types of Wastes; and (d) is properly packaged or containerized.

Nonconforming Waste means any material tendered to Stericycle under this Agreement that is not a Conforming Waste.

Regulated Medical Waste means (i) waste or reusable material derived from medical treatment of an animal or human, which includes diagnosis and immunization, or from biomedical research, which includes production and testing of biological products; (ii) Regulated Waste as that term is defined in 29 CFR 1910.1030, and Regulated Waste or Regulated Medical Waste as defined by 49 CFR 173.134 and all other applicable laws, rules, regulations and guidelines; and (iii) trace chemotherapy discarded items which may have been contaminated provided that such items, including vials and syringes, shall be "empty" as defined in applicable laws, regulations and guidelines.

Services shall have the meaning set forth on the first page of the Agreement.

Sharps Waste means a medical waste object that is capable of cutting or penetrating skin or packaging material and that is contaminated with a pathogen or may become contaminated with a pathogen derived from the medical treatment, diagnosis, immunization, or biomedical research of a human or animal, including but not limited to needles, syringes, scalpels, broken glass, culture slides, culture dishes, broken capillary tubes, broken rigid plastic, and exposed ends of dental wires.

Stericycle shall mean Stericycle, Inc., a Delaware corporation.

Taxes include all sales, use, excise, occupation, environmental, franchise and similar taxes and tax-like fees and charges (but do not include any taxes on Stericycle's net income).

Term has the meaning given to it in Section 2 of the Agreement.

Trace Chemotherapeutic Waste means any personal protective equipment (e.g., mask gowns, barriers, gloves) used in the preparation or dispensing of an antineoplastic drugs, and other trace chemotherapy discarded items which may have been contaminated, including such items as IV tubing, bottles/bags, needles/syringes, drug vials, spill kits provided that such items shall be "empty" as defined in the RCRA and other applicable laws, regulations and guidelines.

Waste Acceptance Policies means Stericycle's waste acceptance policies, instructions, and guidelines

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) requires all businesses to evaluate waste materials prior to disposal in order to determine whether they are regulated as hazardous waste under the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA). This requirement extends to waste pharmaceuticals being disposed of by healthcare facilities. This process of evaluation and analysis is often referred to as "waste characterization."

Stericycle developed this checklist to collect customer information and assist generators with waste characterization, in connection with the Pharmaceutical Waste Services provided by Stericycle. Below you will find examples of both RCRA and Non-RCRA pharmaceutical wastes. If you have additional pharmaceuticals to dispose of that are not listed, please follow the submittal instructions found on page 3 of this document.
