The Governing Body hereby accepts the appointment of the above named physician as Supervisor of Radiology Services as elected by the Medical Staff to assist the hospital in safely maintaining radiologic services according to needs of our patients served.

Such duties may include:

- a) Supervision of Medical Staff to assure interpretation of radiological examinations is made by physicians or licensed independent practitioners competent in the field according to individually granted clinical privileges.
- b) Act as a liaison to the Medical Staff to assure interpretations require the specialized skill of a radiologist for accurate reading.
- c) Coordinate the presence of a qualified physician or licensed independent practitioner during the administration of intravenous contrast media.
- d) Monitors radiologic services, particularly ionizing radiology procedures, to be free from hazards for patients and personnel.
- e) Proper safety precautions must be maintained against radiation hazards. This includes adequate shielding for patients, personnel, and facilities, as well as appropriate storage, use, and disposal of radioactive materials.
- f) Periodic inspection of equipment must be made and hazards identified must be promptly corrected.
- g) Radiation workers must be checked periodically, by the use of exposure meters or badge tests, for amount of radiation exposure.
- h) Radiologic services must be provided only on the order of practitioners with clinical privileges or, consistent with State law, of other practitioners authorized by the medical staff and the governing body to order the services.
- i) Only personnel designated as qualified by the medical staff may use the radiologic equipment and administer procedures.
- j) Records of radiologic services must be maintained.
- k) The radiologist or other practitioner who performs radiology services must sign reports of his or her interpretations
- l) Other duties as assigned.
