

RESOLUTION 993

DECLARING CERTAIN CITY OF CLINTON FIRE DEPARTMENT VEHICLES AND EQUIPMENT TO BE SURPLUS AND AUTHORIZING DISPOSAL BY TRADE IN

WHEREAS, the City of Clinton has identified the vehicle listed on Attachment "A" to this Resolution, which have outlived their useful life and/or are no longer necessary or useful to the City at this time; and should use as a "trade in" toward the purchase of additional vehicles and/or equipment.

WHEREAS, Section 4-3 of the *Clinton City Charter* provides that surplus vehicles and equipment may be disposed of under regulations which the City Council may prescribe; and

WHEREAS, it is the determination of the Clinton City Council that it is in best interest of the City to declare the vehicle set forth in Exhibit "A" surplus and dispose of the vehicle and equipment by "trade in" in an effort to obtain the best value for it.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Council of the City of Clinton hereby declares the vehicle and equipment set forth in Exhibit "A" attached hereto surplus and authorizes the disposal of by a "trade in".

Our plan is to trade in the 2020 Polaris Ranger. We were given a trade in value of \$10,000 but they will need to do a shop inspection before they can confirm this amount. The CFD Women's Aux. will pay the remainder of the cost (approx. \$23,000) to upgrade the Ranger to a 2024 Can Am 6x6 which will be a safer and more stable ride. The ranger was purchased in 2020 with county funds. This will be an apparatus that will be used for grass and wildland firefighting where vehicle access is difficult.
